Subject Competition Trials	All the admission examinations will cover thematic areas selected from subjects within the relevant Scientific-Disciplinary Sector (S.S.D.) or from topics related to the research theme corresponding to the positions funded under the specific programmes mentioned above, according to the candidate's choice made at the time of application. The selection will be aimed at ascertaining, as a prerequisite, the possession of skills on the features of the scientific-disciplinary sector (SSD) of reference. In the oral tests and in the interview, the selection will also be aimed at ascertaining the adequate knowledge of a foreign language, specifically indicated by the candidate when submitting the application.

	Interview On a research project Up to 70 points	Applicants are invited to prepare a presentation of a research project consistent with the curriculum and with the chosen SSD and indicated, under penalty of exclusion, in the application for admission. Candidates who obtain a mark of at least 42/70 in the interview will pass the test. The assessment of the knowledge of the English language is required. The interview may be carried out via "teleconference" for candidates residing abroad or for Italian candidates in cases justified on the basis of adequate documentation. In these cases, the candidate must indicate his Skype address, which will be used for carrying out the test and guarantee the use of a webcam to allow his identification to the Commission of selection The oral interview will also include the discussion and assessment of the research project submitted by the candidate, with a score of up to 35 points included in the total 70 points available.
